Heritage Update



York, South Carolina—acting unilaterally and without authority, a local official in York County, South Carolina, removed from display in the Courthouse in York a Stainless Banner and images of Lee and Jackson; the flag and portraits have been restored; evidently, the individual engaged in this petty virtue-signaling has been apprised that his actions violated South Carolina's Heritage Act (display, pictured above). As of 1 February, it appears that this individual is adopting the position that he can privately interpret the Heritage Act as he sees fit, and does not intend to restore the displayed items without a court order to do so.

Charlottesville, Virginia—the sage continues over the fate of the statues of Lee and Jackson, with city councilors promising to vote for their removal.

Lexington, Virginia—the famous battery of cannons dubbed Matthew, Mark, Luke and John after the four gospels have been restored, and placed back on the grounds of the Virginia Military Institute.

Statewide in Arkansas—a number of Arkansas municipalities scrubbed Lee's Birthday from holiday closure signage.

Treasurer's & Adjutant's Update; Notes on the Last Meeting

As of the last meeting, the Camp had 92 members, plus two transferring.

Finances—on hand, \$5,448.00, with \$291.00 in deposits, with six checks written totaling \$1495 during December, including \$175 for Dr. Larry, \$102.00 for our P. O. Box fee, \$50 to the Southern Legal Resource Center, \$100 to Emma Givens to compensate for refreshments at the Christmas Party, \$352 to the Georgia Division, and \$950 for the pavers on Broad Street; 4 checks remained outstanding as of January 12th, with \$1059 in the Lee-Jackson fund as of that date, \$450 remaining in escrow for the pavers, and \$140 and \$2,103 available for the project fund.

The status of the fountain restoration project relative to the Georgia Division was discussed; additional estimates are going to be needed.

Emma Givens is putting together another T-shirt order if enough people are interesting to get the group rate.
