EDITOR'S NOTES



Brother Southern Compatriots,

Remember: **NO Camp Meeting** in July. If you show up, you won't even get Barbeque—Sconyers is closed too. Recently, a compatriot asked me what a "brevet" rank was. I'm glad he asked, because we (being human) are often afraid to admit we don't know something we've heard for years. So

in the interest of "there's no such thing as a stupid question," here's the definition of a brevet: In many of the world's military establishments, a **brevet** was a warrant giving a commissioned officer a higher rank title as a reward for gallantry or meritorious conduct but without conferring the authority, precedence, or pay of real rank.^[1] An officer so promoted was referred to as being **brevetted**. The promotion would be noted in the officer's title (for example, "*Bvt. Maj. Gen. Joshua L. Chamberlain*").

The Articles of War adopted by the United States Army in 1776 and slightly revised in 1806 established the use and significance of brevet ranks or awards in the U.S. Army. When first used, a brevet commission in the U.S. Army entitled the officer to be identified by a higher rank, but the award had limited effect on the right to higher command or pay. This higher command and pay would last only for the duration of that assignment. The brevet promotion would not affect the officer's seniority and actual permanent rank in the army. Beginning on April 16, 1818, brevet commissions also required confirmation by the United States Senate.

The Division proposed 6 By-Law Amendments. Five failed to pass and one [regarding the wording of the Steven D. Lee Charge] was Tabled until next year).


