YANKEE PRISONS *Camp Morton, Indianapolis*

Named after Indiana's Governor, Oliver P. Morton,

Camp Morton was originally

a training camp for Indiana regiments. In February of 1892, the US Government began using the camp to house Confederate prisoners of war.

The camp contained a prison hospital which was aided by local people's donations of clothing, bedding and food.

Col. Richard Owen of the 60th Indiana regiment served as the first prison commandant.

In 1864, the Knights of the Golden Circle, a pro-South group with a large membership in Indiana, conspired with Southern officers to storm the prison and capture Indianapolis. Morton's spies uncovered the plan, enabling Morton to alert the Indiana Militia and defeat the attack. In April 1865, the remaining 11,408 prisoners were released.

Between 1862 and 1865, the camp's average prison population was 3,214; it averaged fifty deaths per month. Its maximum prison population reached 4,999 in July 1864. More than 1,700 prisoners died at the camp during its four years of operation.

Camp Morton was on Nineteenth and Alabama Streets. The camp was converted into a fairground and later divided into lots for homes. In 1928, a memorial to the Confederate soldiers who died at Camp Morton was erected in Garfield Park and dismantled and destroyed by the "cancel culture" on June 8, 2020.

Senate Bill 1 DEFEATED!

Thanks to the actions of our compatriots and our circle of friends, the Georgia State Senate did not allow Senate Bill 158 out of Committee. It is now too late for it to be voted on.

The massive response of SCV members and other friends of the traditional Southland showed the Senate that there was no support for the proposal to place the M. L. King "Bell" atop the Confederate carving at Stone Mountain and re-purpose the park to "create and maintain an appropriate and suitable monument for civil, voting, and human rights." In fact, there was considerable opposition.

For several years now we have all been depressed as we have seen statues and monuments desecrated or removed. Today we have gained a major victory for the Georgia Division, Sons of Confederate Veterans and our supporters.

All the credit goes to you, the membership, for your efforts. Calling and emailing your State Senators to vote against Senate Bill 158 worked. This Bill was on the verge of passing out of committee and then proceeding to the Senate floor. One Senator even claimed that passage was "a done deal."

The extra effort to write, email, call and visit your legislators made a tremendous difference.

We have had a busy month preparing for the inevitable battle to save the monument. We have met with Randy Sheppard, Attorney at Law, who will be our local attorney and we are consulting with Martin K. O'Toole [*GA Division, SCV*] with regard to [*our*] next steps. We currently have the names of four attorneys who are familiar with the litigations going on in GA regarding the illegal monument removals, and will be enlisting one of them to help us and to work with Randy Sheppard as the trial attorney.

Attorneys for the cities of Brunswick and Savannah have advised the Commissioners that they are opening themselves up to individual [*personal*] lawsuits if they move forward with monument removals.

GA MONUMENTS UPDATE

The Georgia Division SCV has been diligent and vigorous in defending our Monuments statewide.

The Division has filed lawsuits specifically against:

- City of Cuthbert & Randolph County,
- the City of Brunswick and Glynn County,
- Gwinnet County,
- Newton County,
- Rockdale County,
- Henry County,
- the City of Athens and Clarke County,
- The City of Alpharetta (banned the Battle Flag), and
- The City of Columbus and Linwood Cemetery.

Several of these suits also name the Mayors and commissioners individually and personally liable. At this time, we continue to gather all legal filings in the cases involving Covington, Macon, Gwinnett Co., Dekalb, McDonough, as well as watching the threats in Brunswick and Savannah.

GA Election Reform Bill Signed!
