

Captured twice on these scouting forays, he escaped twice. He declined to surrender at Appomattox, and brought his rifle home with him. That rifle now resides in the Augusta museum. YANKEE PRISONS

Johnson's Island, Ohio

In late 1861, Federal officials selected Johnson's Island as the site for a prisoner of war camp to hold up to 2,500 captured Confederate officers. Located in Sandusky Bay, the island was used as a depot for Confederate officers from 1862 to 1865. The prison housed more than at 3,200 prisoners at its peak.

The prison opened in April 1862. A 15-foot-high wooden stockade surrounded 12 two-story prisoner housing barracks, a hospital, latrines, sutler's stand, three wells, a pest house, and two large mess halls

More than 15,000 men passed through Johnson's Island until it was closed in September 1865. About 300 prisoners died as a result of the harsh Ohio winters, food and fuel shortages, and disease. Johnson's Island had one of the lowest mortality rates of any Civil War prison. Confederates made many escape attempts, including efforts by some to walk across the frozen Lake Erie to freedom in Canada, but only a handful of escapes were successful.

The Hoffman Battalion of the 128th Ohio Volunteers became the official guards of the prison under William S. Pierson, a former Mayor of Sandusky. Because of his cruelty to prisoners and his inability to handle problems and keep the prison in good order, he was replaced. In January 1864 Brigadier General Harry



Terry replaced Pierson. A few months later (May, 1864) Colonel Charles Hill took command until the end of the war.

On June 8, 1910 Moses Ezekiel's statue, a monument to the Confederate prisoners held on the island, was unveiled. In 1990 Johnson's Island was designated a National Historic Landmark. A causeway was built to connect it with the mainland. The Confederate cemetery is accessible to the public. Groundpenetrating radar studies have proved that several graves lie outside its fence. Heidelberg University conducts yearly archeology digs at the prison site.

The Friends and Descendants of Johnson's Island Civil War Prison was formed in 2001 to help in the preservation, interpretation, and education of the Johnson's Island Prison site. In conjunction with Heidelberg University, the Friends have sponsored educational and research programming at this National Historic Landmark.

We have met with Randy Sheppard, Attorney at Law, who will be our local attorney and we are consulting with Martin K. O'Toole [GA Division, SCV] with regard to [our] next steps. We currently have the names of four attorneys who are familiar with the litigations going on in GA regarding the illegal monument removals, and will be enlisting one of them to help us and to work with Randy Sheppard as the trial attorney.

Attorneys for the cities of Brunswick and Savannah have advised the Commissioners that they are opening themselves up to individual [personal] lawsuits if they move forward with monument removals.
