





Gettysburg Address Was A Lie

The Battle of Gettysburg, one of the most noted battles of the Civil War, (War for Southern Independence) was fought on July 1–3, 1863. On Nov. 19, 1863, the field was dedicated as a national cemetery by President Lincoln in a two-minute speech that was to become immortal, the Gettysburg Address.

The Battle of Gettysburg, fought four months earlier, was the bloodiest battle of the Civil War. Over the course of three days, more than 45,000 men were killed, injured, captured or went missing. The battle also proved to be the turning point of the war. The South's defeat and retreat from Gettysburg marked the beginning of the Southern army's ultimate defeat.

The 278 word speech of the 16th President dedicated a national cemetery and it is claimed that he rededicated America to the hopes and dreams expressed in the Declaration of Independence. The Patriot and Union newspaper of Harrisburg Pennsylvania and other newspapers were not impressed by Lincoln's speech. They said, "The president acted without sense and without constraint in a panorama that was more for the benefit of his Party than for the honor of the dead.

Lincoln's Gettysburg Address was a lie. Famous editor and journalist **H.L Mencken** wrote about the speech in 1920 saying that the speech claims that "The Union soldiers who died at Gettysburg sacrificed their lives for self determination so that government of the people, by the people, and for people should not perish from the earth. It is difficult to imagine anything any more untrue. The Union soldiers in that battle fought against self determination. It was the Confederates who fought for the right of their people to govern themselves. The practical effect of the battle of Gettysburg was the destruction of the sovereignty of the states.

The Confederates went into battle free but came out with their freedom subject to the supervision and veto of the North, and for 20 years they had scarcely more liberty than convicts in a penitentiary. It did not usher in a new birth of freedom. It consolidated Federal power and gave birth to the fascist system and imperial presidency under which we now suffer".

In 1958 Ruby Haley received a letter from her uncle, answering some questions about their family history. That document sets the stage for a tremendous debut novel from William Thomas.

Escaping poverty and looking for opportunity, Michael Haley came to America from Ireland in 1847. He married above his station, had a life of adventure, hard work, and tragedy, but died young—leaving his children orphaned. Runaway Haley is a fictional family saga, imagining what might have happened in the lives of two generations of the Haley family in the deep South in centuries past.

Filled with heartache and struggle; set against the backdrop of the Civil War, reconstruction, plagues of disease, and incredible challenges; the Haley's persevered. Strengthened by the desire to keep their family together, they never abandoned their dreams.

This imaginative fiction fills in the gaps where the family and historical records fall short. As a reclamation of the Haley family story, Dr. Thomas joins other Southern writers who demonstrate what James Ronald Kennedy describes as follows:

In the South, history is a living thing. Yankees and scalawag Southerners get their history from history books by Yankees to glorify Yankee heroes and ideas. . . but Southerners, we get history from our family.
